Ms. Lewis is nationally recognized for her proficiency in Special Needs Trust planning for persons challenged by disabilities, and is a frequent speaker and author on this topic. She is a Fellow of the American College of Trust and Estate Counsel (ACTEC), and an active member of the Special Needs Alliance, where she has served as Co-Editor of that organization's monthly e-newsletter, *The Voice*. She is also a member of the American Bar Association, the New York Bar Association Elder Law Section, and the State Bar of Georgia Fiduciary Law Section. She is a former Co-Chair of the Long-Term Care, Medicaid and Special Needs Trusts Committee of the Elder Law, Disability Planning and Bioethics Group of the Real Property, Probate and Trust Law Section of the American Bar Association.

Ms. Lewis received her B.A. degree in French and political science, with highest honors, from Wellesley College in 1981. She earned her J.D. degree from Cornell University Law School in 1984. She is admitted to practice law in both New York and Georgia. Ms. Lewis currently serves as Board Chair of Eagle Ranch, a non-profit residential counseling program for children in northeast Georgia that works to unify troubled families. She also serves on the Board of Wesley Woods Senior Living, which provides affordable housing for Georgia seniors of limited means, and is a consultant to Better Living Together, Inc., which seeks to provide affordable housing in Greater Atlanta for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities and others of modest means. Ms. Lewis also currently serves on the Boards of the Center for the Visually Impaired and the Bobby Dodd Institute, and previously served as the Board Chair of Georgia Community Supports & Solutions (now InCommunity), all of which support persons with disabilities and their families. She has served on the Board of Cumberland Academy of Georgia, a private school for children with autism, and is a former member of the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Legacy Advisors Leadership Council. She is a past Chair of the Board of Directors of the Girl Scouts of Greater Atlanta, Inc. and a former Trustee of the Wellesley College Alumnae Association. She is an active member of St. Jude the Apostle Catholic Church in Atlanta, and has been trained as an annulment advocate with the Metropolitan Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Atlanta. She is an active member of the Serra Club of Atlanta, which supports seminarians and religious vocations. In her vast amounts of free time, she volunteers for Canine Assistants, a non-profit based in Milton, Georgia, which raises and trains certified service dogs for recipients with disabilities.

Ms. Lewis has authored an article on “Planning Challenges for Beneficiaries With Special Needs,” published in *Estate Planning*, Volume 46, Number 3, March 2019.
